RE: Fish Stocking Regulations

Dear President and Commissioners,

The Department of Fish and Game's proposed fish stocking regulations threaten my family business that has been in operation over 10 years and supports over 20 other families.

Given that California grows some of the healthiest fish in the world under existing regulations, there is no need for additional and costly regulations, especially during these tough economic times.

By some estimates, these unprecedented regulations could cost property owners upwards of tens of thousands to hundreds of thousands of dollars, depending on the location and size of the water body; this expense may be even more for fish hatcheries. Such costs will have a devastating impact on California's aquaculture industry and will result in fishing lakes and fishponds to be simply abandoned all together.

These regulations not only threaten my livelihood, they also threaten California's economy. With less fish provided by private hatcheries and stocking ponds recreational fishing will decline, threatening California's outdoor industry as well as communities dependent on recreational tourism. In addition, consumers will suffer higher prices when California grown fish is no longer available at their local grocery store and restaurant.
